

# SEA BERRY

## *Hippophae rhamnoides*

Well-known in Europe, Sea Berries are highly prized for vitamin rich, orange fruit and graceful ornamental qualities. Fruit is an excellent source of vitamins C, A & E and makes delicious juice. Plants have either male or female flowers, and female plants will produce fruit only when a male plant is present. Foliage is narrow and frosty blue-green and branches can be thorny. Sea Berries adapt to various soil conditions and have no pest or disease problems.

Grows to 8-12' tall – loves full sun – Hardy -40F.

<b>BOTANICA</b>	More compact, improved cultivar from Russian breeding program. Same high yields in a smaller space. Ripens late July.
<b>MALE</b>	Pollinator for female sea berries and an attractive ornamental shrub in its own right. One Male can pollinate up to 8 females.
<b>ORANGE ENERGY</b>	This patented variety is prized for its incredible crops of large, bright orange, flavorful and vitamin-rich berries. Crops are so heavy that in September the plant essentially turns orange.
<b>RADIANT</b>	A Siberian variety prized for its large, juicy and flavorful fruit, which is particularly high in Vitamin C. Forms a compact, attractive shrub growing to about 8 ft. in height.
