

# FIG VARIETIES FOR 2024

**Figs are not only a sweet, delicious summer treat, they are easy to grow and their beautiful foliage and form add a tropical look to the garden.**

Green, bronze, and mahogany colored fruit with juicy amber or red flesh ripens during hot summer months. Ripe fruit will be soft to the touch and will wilt on the stem. Many of our varieties produce a second crop of fruit in September. All of the varieties we carry are self-fertile.

Fig trees are pest-free, adaptable to many climate and soil conditions, and drought tolerant once established. They can be pruned to stay small, espaliered onto a fence or hot wall, or allowed to sprawl.

We often have more varieties of figs in small (#1) pots than in large sizes. Ask about where our small fruit trees are stocked. *We're happy to help!*

**Grows to 15-20', loves sun and heat, hardy in USDA Zones 7-9.**

<b>BLACK SPANISH</b>	An extremely hardy, fast grower originating in Spain, it often yields two crops of sweet, mahogany fruit.
<b>BROWN TURKEY</b>	Med-large fruit with brown-maroon skin and sweet, juicy, firm, meaty flesh. Excellent all-purpose. Ripens in September.
<b>KING</b>	Heavy yielding variety produces large, high quality, green fruit with amber flesh. Great fresh, canned, or dried.
<b>LATTARULA</b> (Italian Honey)	Greenish-yellow fruit with sweet, amber colored flesh. Good all-purpose. Well adapted to the PNW. May ripen two crops, one in July and one in September.
<b>NEGRONNE</b>	Vigorous, extremely hardy Mission-type fig suited to cooler areas. Produces two crops of small, jet-black fruit with deep red flesh and fine flavor.
<b>OLYMPIAN</b>	Green-purple striped fruits with flavorful, violet flesh. Usually produces two crops per year. Hybridized in Olympia, WA so well suited to the cooler maritime climate of the PNW.
<b>PETER'S HONEY</b>	Lovely, greenish-yellow fruit with dark amber flesh and very sweet flavor super for fresh eating. Requires plenty of hot sun to ripen fully.
<b>PETITE NEGRA</b>	Naturally dwarf tree suitable for pot culture. Fruit is large, black, and richly sweet.
<b>STELLA</b>	Suited to cooler climates, Stella yields large fruit with sweet, reddish-purple flesh.
<b>VERN'S BROWN TURKEY</b>	Brown fruit with sweet, amber flesh. Excellent all-purpose. Reliable producer, two crops in most years. Ripens July-Sept.
