

RASPBERRIES

Raspberries are divided into 2 classes by fruit bearing habit:

JUNE-BEARING: Bears fruit in early summer on 2 year old canes.

EVERBEARING: Bears fruit on ends of canes late in first season; and laterally on same canes early in second season.



PLANTING: Set out plants 1" deeper than originally grown, spreading the roots 2 1/2-3' apart. Prune back heavily at planting. Plants will produce 3-5 canes the first year. The roots will produce fruit for ten years.

CULTURE: Best in full sun. Well-drained soil is essential. Plants need regular watering: a minimum of 1 inch of water per week, especially during flowering and fruiting. Feed with a balanced fertilizer at bloom time. Keep the area well weeded.

STAKING & PRUNING: Raspberries perform best when trained on supports. String wires at 2.5' intervals on 2 stout posts spaced 5' apart. Tie canes to wire. On June-bearing varieties, prune out entire cane after fruiting. On Everbearing types, prune upper portion of cane after fall fruiting, and then remaining cane after spring crop. RASPBERRIES

VARIETIES EXPECTED FOR 2026

AMITY	Everbearing. Big sweet red berries with excellent classic raspberry flavor in June and again in late summer. Delicious fresh or for jam.
ANNE	Everbearing. Large yellow berries with sweet mild flavor in mid-summer to fall. Great for snacking or processing. High yielding.
CANBY	June-bearing. Big crops of yummy large red fruit in June for eating fresh, freezing or canning. Thornless canes make harvest a breeze!
CAROLINE	Everbearing. One of the largest fruits in fall, with strong raspberry flavor. Caroline also has higher nutrient levels than other raspberries.
CASCADE DELIGHT	June-bearing. Large red fruit with strong raspberry flavor has a long harvest season. Nearly thornless. Scoffs at heavy wet soil.
DOUBLE GOLD	Everbearing. Beautiful peachy gold to pink fruit in summer and fall with excellent flavor. Very productive and disease resistant.
FALL GOLD	Everbearing. Sweet golden berries in late summer to fall. Great for fresh eating and processing. Tolerates a wide variety of soils.
GLENCOE	Everbearing. Purple berries have a unique flavor, delicious for snacking, preserving or making wine. Compact habit, good for small spaces.
HERITAGE	Everbearing. Large sweet dark red berries with mild flavor in July, with a superior fall crop from September to frost. Self-supporting canes.
JOAN J	Everbearing. Big crops of large firm red berries with good flavor from August-October. Thornless canes make picking & pruning so much easier!
KILLARNEY	June-bearing. Large, firm, extra-sweet, intense red berries ripen in mid-season. Very productive and disease resistant with strong canes.
LATHAM	June-bearing. Large to XL deep red full flavored berries with wonderful texture. Ripens for 3 weeks in late June and early July. Strong, highly productive canes 4-5' tall. Disease resistant.
NOVA	June bearing. Loads of flavorful firm red fruit ripen over a long season from mid-June into July. Extra cold tolerant, and disease resistant.
RASPBERRY SHORTCAKE	June-bearing. Yummy red berries on a dwarf plant, perfect for containers and small spaces at 2-3' tall. THORNLESS too!
TAHI	June-bearing. Large black berries in tight clusters, set on thornless upright canes. Delicious fresh, for jam or freezing. Z5
VINTAGE	Everbearing. Super big, super sweet, super delicious red berries from August to frost.
