

SEABERRIES

Well-known in Europe, Sea Berries are highly prized for vitamin rich, orange fruit and graceful ornamental qualities. The fruit is an excellent source of vitamins C, A, and E, and makes delicious juice. The flavor is described as extra rich orange juice with added pineapple and passionfruit!

Plants have either male or female flowers, and female plants will produce fruit only when a male plant is present. Foliage is narrow and frosty blue-green, and branches can be thorny. Sea Berries adapt to various soil conditions and have no pest or disease problems. As highly drought tolerant nitrogen fixers they are excellent for use in permaculture and organic farming.

Grows to 8-12’ tall, loves full sun, hardy to -40°F.

VARIETIES EXPECTED FOR 2026

BOTANICA	More compact, improved cultivar from Russian breeding program. Same high yields in a smaller space. Ripens late July-August.
LEIKORA	Heavy bearer in late Aug-Sept. The laden branches make colorful additions to cut floral arrangements. Bred in Germany.
MALE	Pollinizer for female sea berries, and an attractive ornamental shrub in its own right. One Male can pollinate up to 8 females.
ORANGE ENERGY	This variety is prized for its incredible crops of large, flavorful berries. Crops are so heavy that in September the entire plant essentially turns orange.
TITAN	Produces heavy crops of bright orange, flavorful berries great for juice, preserves, and general culinary uses. Flavor described as slightly sweeter than other varieties.
