

TABLE GRAPES

Most of these grapes are American varieties which are better suited to our climate. Most are slip skin, with soft flesh and a distinctive, musky flavor and aroma. Some will also make a nice wine. Please see variety descriptions for details.



PLANTING: Plant grapes at least 6-8 feet apart with 8-9 feet between rows in well-drained soil. Plant at the same depth as in the pot. Trim vine down to two remaining buds.

CULTURE: Choose a site which is not in a frost pocket, and is parallel to the prevailing winds. Full sun is required to ripen the fruit, so rows are best oriented in a north/south direction. Grapes are adapted to a wide range of soil types, but do require good drainage. Water newly planted vines regularly (1-2 inches of water per week until mid-summer); mature vines are deeply rooted and require only occasional water. Watering prior to harvest will increase fruit size. Mulch once a year in spring with aged manure. Too much fertilizer will cause the flower buds to fall off.

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CANADICE	Seedless. Sweet, red, medium-size fruit with a hint of spice. Great for juice, jellies & wine. Keeps long on the vine. Ripe in Aug-September.
CENTENNIAL	Seedless. Large clusters of big white grapes with a sweet mild muscat flavor. Good fresh, dried, and for juice.
CONCORD	Seeded. Aromatic, round, dark blue fruit with distinctive grape juice flavor ripen in August.
EINSET	Seedless. Sweet bright red fruit perfect for plucking and munching. Ripens in late September. Resistant to botrytis and cracking.
FAITH	Seedless. Big oblong dark blue fruit with balanced sweet and sour flavor. Makes delicious jelly, juice and fresh snacks.
JOY	Seedless. Very flavorful, luscious, blue-black fruiting introduction from the U. of Arkansas. Early-mid-season non-slipskin, with excellent crack and disease resistance.
JUPITER	Seedless. Early maturing large, red-blue grapes with excellent wild muscat flavor and crisp texture resist cracking. Very productive.
MADELEINE ANGEVINE	Seeded. Petite round yellow fruits used as a table or wine grape. Well suited to cool mild PNW regions, as it ripens early.
MARQUIS	Seedless. Large yellow-green fruit in big clusters with sweet juicy melting flesh and thick skin that softens as it ripens.
NEPTUNE	Seedless. Extra sweet yellow-green grapes are a delicious summer treat fresh off the vine, and they’re great for juice or jelly too. Disease resistant.
NEW YORK MUSCAT	Seeded. Red-black fruit with few seeds, fine muscat flavor & rich sweetness. Excellent for table, juice, and wine. Medium vigor and productivity is balanced by superior flavor.
RELIANCE	Seedless. Large clusters sweet pink-red fruit with tender skin and melting flesh. Outstanding flavor ideal for jelly and juice. Ripe in September.
SWEET SEDUCTION	Seedless. Golden-green fruit with succulent muscat flavor. Very productive, ripens in late September.
THOMCORD	Seedless. Delectable cross between classics Concord and Thompson that yields giant clusters of plump, juicy, blue fruit in September.
VANESSA	Seedless. Vigorous, moderately hardy vine that produces loose bunches of medium sized, deep red fruit with spicy, aromatic flavor.
VENUS	Seedless. Large bluish-black fruit with sweet, crisp flesh. Good for preserves, jellies, fresh eating and wines. Productive and vigorous.
